Listed above are the **Ecumenical Councils** of the Catholic Church. An Ecumenical Council (**the gathering of all of the Bishops of the world under the leadership of the Pope**) is the highest teaching authority in the church. It has always been said that it takes a minimum of 50 years for the teachings of an Ecumenical Council to fully take root in the life of the church. The most recent Ecumenical Council, Vatican II, is no exception. This particular Council, which met for three months in the Fall of each year from 1962 through 1965, issued many challenges for the Church. This Council, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, has called us to radical renewal in the our life as followers of Christ. The Spirit who called this Council together through the leadership of Blessed Pope John XXIII still lives in the Church and guides us to the renewal and growth we are called to by the Second Vatican Council. May we be open to and responsive to the Spirit calling us the be renewed.

LITURGY COMMITTEE NOTES

**A Summer Series on the Parts of the Mass
Proclamation of the Word of God**

Did you know?

After the introductory rites have been completed, the Liturgy of the Word begins with the proclamation of the scriptural texts. These consist of the first reading, responsorial psalm, second reading, Gospel acclamation, and Gospel reading.

The Scriptures of the Day are meant to be proclaimed and listened to. The assembly participates here, not by reading along, but by listening attentively and verbalizing its appropriate responses. For in the readings, as explained by the homily, God speaks to his people, opening up to them the mystery of redemption and salvation, and offering them spiritual nourishment; and Christ himself is present in the midst of the faithful through His Word. By their silence and singing the people make God's Word their own, and they also affirm their adherence to it by means of the Profession of Faith. Finally, having been nourished by it, they pour out their petitions in the Prayer of the Faithful for the needs of the entire Church and for the salvation of the whole world.
