### STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

### 2009 DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL LET US DO GREAT THINGS TOGETHER

As of our latest report from the Diocesan Appeal Office, **391 individuals or families** in our parish had pledged **\$54,814.50** to the **2009 Appeal**. This amount is **46.04%** of our **parish goal of \$119,055.00**.

**LITURGY COMMITTEE NOTES**

**The Sacred Space, Furnishings, Vesture, Books  
Do you know about the SANCTORAL CYCLE?**

Running parallel to the cycle of the liturgical year is what is called the sanctoral cycle: these solemnities, feasts, and memorials that fall on particular days of the year. For the most part, these are days that celebrate particular saints or events in the lives of Jesus and the Virgin Mary. These days are ranked in order of importance: Solemnities, Feasts, Obligatory Memorials and Optional Memorials.

Solemnities are the most important and must be celebrated even if they fall on Sundays in Ordinary Time (though never on the Sundays of Advent, Lent, or the Easter Season).

Feasts are next in importance and must be celebrated but only on weekdays. They do not take the place of Sundays – with two exceptions: the feast of the Holy Family is always celebrated on the Sunday after Christmas, and the feast of Baptism of the Lord is usually celebrated on the last Sunday of the Christmas season.

Obligatory memorials must be celebrated but only on weekdays outside of Lent. They do not take the place of Sunday and, during Lent, may be replaced by the regular Lenten weekday Mass.

Optional Memorials need not be celebrated at all. Optional memorials usually celebrate saints that have a connection to a particular group or area.
