LITURGY COMMITTEE NOTES

Did you know?

For the first time in three years the feast of the Baptism of the Lord falls on the Sunday after the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. In a real way, today continues last Sunday's Solemnity. The Baptism of the Lord is yet another powerful revelation (manifestation or epiphany) of Christ's identity: God's beloved Son, on whom His favor rests. Like the visit of the Magi and the wedding feast of Cana, the Baptism of Christ by John in the River Jordan is an experience of God's action and presence revealed in Christ. The feast of the Baptism of the Lord closes the Christmas season. Tomorrow we begin Ordinary time which continues until Ash Wednesday which occurs early this year on February 6, 2008. The youth ministry at Our Lady of the Snows is all encompassing. We have several different Teams based on different youth interests. Any high school youth can join any of these teams at any time. We

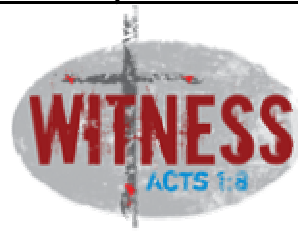
hold a general planning meeting on every **Wednesday night from 7:00PM until 8:00PM.**
