THE FIFTIETH DAY OF EASTER: PENTECOST

Did you know?

Today’s reading from the Acts of the Apostles (1:12-14) tells us that after Jesus ascended to the Father in heaven, the 11 apostles went back to Jerusalem. They gathered in the Upper Room with Jesus’ mother, Mary, and other women of the group to pray. Jesus’ mission on this earth was finished. The mission of these faithful followers was just beginning. There was no doubt how they were to spend the rest of their time on earth.

Every person is born with a life mission to carry out. It is not the same mission as the apostles, nor is it the same as the mission of any other human being. Some people may wrongly think that their mission is the same as their job. We discover our mission by noticing what talents and gifts God has given us and how we can best use them. It may be the gift of hospitality, of listening to others, skills to help people overcome personal conflicts, or some other blessing. Like the work of the apostles, the work of our life is to use our gifts in God’s service. If you need help naming your mission, ask those who know you well to share their impressions of you. Think about things you have done that people seem to especially appreciate. Then remind yourself each day in your morning prayer that this is what God has given you to do. This is your mission.
