STEWARDSHIP/SACRIFICIAL GIVING

Thank you for your attention to the request made at all Masses on the weekend of October 20 and 21 for your consideration of an **increase in your weekly offering**. Please remember that all that anyone asks is that we do the best we can. If it is not possible for you to make an increase, please do what you can and that will be very good. If you can see your way clear to make a slight increase (we need four to five cents on the dollar in the weekly offering), please do so. **The increase is necessary to make ends meet in the current fiscal year while doing the same things that we have been doing as a parish community. Thank you for your continuing generosity.** During the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2007, our total collections for the year showed an increase over the previous year. This and some increases in donations and income from fund-raising helped us very much. However, the increases in the total collections were found (and appreciated very much) in Christmas, Easter and the Improvement Fund. The average weekly offerings actually decreased slightly from the previous fiscal year. Hopefully, the Christmas Offering, Easter Offering, and Improvement Fund will continue to increase **and our weekly offering will improve at the**

same time. Between four and five percent would be a tremendous help. **Thank you for whatever you can do!**

The administration of food and water even by artificial means is, in principle, an ordinary and proportionate means of preserving life. It is therefore obligatory to the extent to which, and for as long as, it is shown to accomplish its proper finality, which is the hydration and nourishment of the patient. In this way, suffering and death by starvation are prevented.

LITURGY COMMITTEE NOTES

Did you know?

On Friday of this week, the Church will celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. This basilica is the cathedral church of Rome and was built on land that was owned and given to the Church by the Laterani family. The basilica was dedicated in 324 by Pope Sylvester I. As the cathedral church of Rome, Saint John Lateran (named after both Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the evangelist) is the Mother Church of all churches in Rome and in the world. IN other words, Saint John is the cathedral church for the universal Church. In any diocese, the role of the cathedral is extremely important. It serves as the Mother Church of all the

parishes of that diocese, and is the Church of the local Bishop. In fact, the word *cathedral* comes from the Latin word *cathedra*, meaning "chair", referring to the Bishop's chair, a symbol of his role as chief shepherd of the diocese. It makes sense that the whole Church should celebrate the anniversary of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica; it is the mother church of all Catholics. (Written by Steve LaRue; Sourcebook, 2007)
