LITURGY COMMITTEE NOTES

A Summer Series – The Parts of the Mass

Did you know?

Our Eucharistic Celebration or Mass is made up of two main parts, the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Preceded by introductory rites, the Liturgy of the Word consists of the proclamation of the Word of God, the profession of faith, and the prayer of the faithful. The various sections of the Liturgy of the Eucharist are the preparation of the gifts, the Eucharistic prayer, and the Communion Rite, followed by a brief concluding rite.

In both parts together we experience God and participate in a single integrated act of worship. It is through hearing the Word of God that we believe in sharing the Bread of Life and through sharing the Bread of Life that we are empowered to live the Word of God.

Ordinary Time is a good opportunity for us to remember some of the basic, yet often taken for granted, aspects of our understanding of the Mass. **Beginning next week we will be looking at each part of the Mass.** Please watch and read this column each week.
