A Summer Series – The Introductory Rites

Did you know?

As Mass begins, we hear the church bells ringing. Before watches and clocks were a part of everyone's life, the bells were used to announce to the countryside the hour of the Mass. The use of bells continues today.

Last week we talked about the entrance song. As the ministers are entering the church we all sing this opening hymn for the Church has gathered together to open the celebration. The assembled group is united as a community to properly prepare to hear God's Word and celebrate the Eucharist.

As the ministers reach the altar, the ministers reverence it with a profound bow. The priest (and deacon if one is present) then kisses it and may incense it as well. The altar is greeted and honored in this way because it is a symbol not only of Christ but of the church as well; because it is a place of prayer and sacrifice; and because it is the table from which we are nourished with the Bread of Life.

PARISH CLUSTER MEETING

Cluster 4 (Our Lady of the Snows/Church of St. Benedict; Our Lady of the Abingtons; St. Gregory

The three Core Cluster Committees have now met in April and May. We looked at the Current Reality and Preferred Future in the areas of Eucharist, Prayer, and Communion; Evangelization, Formation, and Education; Vocation; Stewardship and Justice, and Stewardship and Administration. We have prayed together and studied the four models: Consolidated Parishes, Linked Parishes, Partnership Parishes, and In Solidum. We have suggested to the Planning Commission that we become Partnership Parishes.

Partnership Parishes create joint programs; when appropriate, they share staff to enhance the quality of ministry and practice good stewardship of resources; and they share in-services or retreats for parish pastoral councils, finance councils, or parish committees. We made the suggestion of Partnership Parishes because each of our parishes enjoys population and financial stability. Our buildings are sound and well maintained; and our councils, ministries, and programs are thriving. We believe at this time we should retain our status as individual parishes under the leadership of individual pastors. The bond we already share is excellent preparation for our becoming an official partnership. As such, we would function far more efficiently in the present and have a foundation in place for linkage or consolidation if either becomes an eventual necessity.
