LITURGY COMMITTEE NOTES

Did you know?

The major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Triduum, and Easter are now past, but about half the year remains for us to celebrate our redemption in Christ in a more general way. Before we resume the counted Sundays of Ordinary Time, however, we devote this Sunday and the next to celebrating two profound mysteries of our faith: The Trinity and the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

A special feast in honor of the Holy Trinity began in monastic communities as early as the ninth century. By the fourteenth century, the whole Western church was observing it as it does today, on the Sunday after Pentecost.

We received approximately 300 responses to the parish survey that was conducted in conjunction with the Diocese of Scranton Process: *Called to Holiness and Mission*. Eucharist, Prayer, and Communion: In the section on Prayer and Worship and Sacramental celebration (Recall that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the life and mission of the parish.) our parish met, and in several areas, exceeded expectations. In the section on Discipleship and Collaborative Leadership Style (Recall that disciples are formed by the Eucharist.) our parish met, and in two areas, exceeded expectations. Our strengths are: people are involved in the liturgy in a very active and prayerful way. The liturgy forms a community that is holy. We are a

welcoming parish that offers many ministries and programs, and we are open to suggestions for new programs. We hope to grow stronger in our liturgies by encouraging more participation and by having our homilies better reflect current issues. We would also like to provide more education on the Scriptures and church tradition.

THE JAMAICAN MINISTRY:

A Twinning Project

KICK OFF DATES – MAY 31/JUNE 1, 2008

Our Lady of the Snows/Church of St. Benedict will be establishing a Fund for the Jamaican Ministry Project. One of the most crucial issues in Jamaica is education. The Passionists are trying to educate the people of Jamaica so that they can help solve their own poverty. Tuition at the Catholic College of Mandeville, which is a teacher's college, is \$2,000.00 a year. Transportation can cost \$10/day for the college students who have to travel long distances. Books average \$500/year. The parishes have basic schools at which the tuition is about \$300/year. The basic schools also provide meals for the children and teachers, sometimes the only meal they receive during the day.

This may be an opportunity to assist a Jamaican family with tuition to their local Catholic School. The Catholic schools are safe havens and provide much better education and nutrition than can be found in the public schools. The Catholic schools teach religious education and are a source of evangelization in the community. MOUNT CALVARY RETREAT HOUSE - The Mount Calvary Retreat House has been in operation in Mandeville since 1973. Sister Bernadette Hughes, CP and various Passionist priests provide weekly retreats, an annual biblical institute, youth camps, and ongoing personal spiritual direction. The retreat center is dedicated to the original ideal of St. Paul of the Cross, the founder of the Passionists, as a place for personal reflection on issues of human and spiritual development. The retreat house is also involved in the Priestly Formation program which is providing local men the opportunity to become priests for the Jamaican people.
