LITURGY COMMITTEE NOTES

Did you know?

Today's solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ celebrates the doctrine of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The feast was established in the thirteenth century not long after the Fourth Lateran Council reaffirmed this doctrine in the face of much theological debate of the issue. In former days, it was known as Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, and there was a separate feast of the Precious Blood. The current church calendar combines the two into a single celebration.

In many places of the world, it is still celebrated on its traditional day, the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. That day was chosen by the church to remember Holy Thursday, the day on which the Eucharist was instituted.
